Spring has finally arrived and I for one am thrilled! You can tell when one is getting older, you get to the point that you complain more and more about the snow and the cold.

Let me start by telling you I have received three bids for replacing the sewer pipe in the back parking lot. This should end the pooling problem we have had with standing water in the back lot, near the garage. A camera was passed into the pipe and it was determined that the pipe was collapsed and a portion of it is running uphill. The plan is to raise the drain in the parking lot a couple of inches and replace the entire pipe from the drain to the catch basin near the curb. I'm told this should solve the problem once and forever. (I use the term forever, loosely) Work will begin shortly after the Vestry selects and approve the contractor.

I would like to thank Andy Ferko for his generous donation of some additional handi-capped parking signs and the steel poles that they will be mounted on. Also on the special Thank you list is Gill Fritzsche re-gluing one of the rocking chairs and re-staining the modesty panel in the Sanctuary. The modesty panel was damaged by the spilling of the hand sanitizer we used to keep up front.

The large red tower doors have been repaired and now open and close easily. Thank God for that. Speaking of doors, we had some vandalism sometime between Saturday night and Easter Sunday morning. Someone thought it would be cute to squirt glue into the locks and between the doors of the parish hall and the Ridgewood Dr. entrance. We were able to get them cleaned out and operable. A police report was filed.

I have scheduled Saturday, April 17th as our Annual Clean-up, Fix-up, Plant-up and Paint-up Day. I believe it is Earth Day also, so we will meet at 10 am and hopefully quit by 2 pm. Lunch will be served at about noon. If you can paint, rake leaves, pick up debris, plant flowers, help in the kitchen, clean windows, or anything else it would help. Many hands make the task easier. If you can spare a few hours on April 17th, it would be very much appreciated. Remember - It is **your** church! Let's make it proud.

### Loan \$25 to change lives through Kiva

Give a man a fish and you feed him for a day; teach a man to fish and you feed him for a lifetime. Kiva borrowers already know how to fish. They just need a loan to buy a net.

Helping the poor is a theme present in many religions and a variety of faiths, and is a concept that brings people together of all different backgrounds around the world.

Kiva is an engaging way for us and our faith-based group to help the poor, and have a large impact over time.

We wanted to let you know about Kiva ([www.kiva.org](http://www.kiva.org)), a non-profit that allows you to lend as little as \$25 to a specific low-income entrepreneur across the globe.

You choose who to lend to - whether a baker in Afghanistan, a goat herder in Uganda, a farmer in Peru, a restaurateur in Cambodia, or a tailor in Iraq - and as they repay their loan, you get your money back. It's a powerful and sustainable way to empower someone right now to lift themselves out of poverty.

Lending through Kiva allows your money to go further than making a one-time donation. When your loan is repaid, you can withdraw the money or make another loan. The same funds can be loaned and re-loaned over and over again, so the impact grows over time without funding having to grow.

As of November 2009, Kiva has facilitated over \$100 million in loans.

**In January 2010, on the behalf of All Saint's, your Outreach Committee chose the portfolio of Luz in Peru and lent her \$25 towards her clothing sales business. As of March, we are pleased to report to you that 14% of our loan has been repaid and the repayment status is on time!**
