Treasurer's Report through May 2010

Pledge receipts were disappointing in April (\$1,000 under budget). Fortunately the trend reversed itself and pledges came in \$1,200 over budget in May. Year-to-date Pledge Offerings are still short of budget by \$2,400.

Year-to-date Disbursements are \$4,500 over budget. This is due primarily to unexpected pension and health insurance costs we must pay to get caught up. Other overages include high water bills due to a running commode (it's been fixed) and additional office expenses for Easter mailings.

This continues to be a challenging year for us. Thank you for all of the support you've been able to give. Please try to keep your pledges up to date.

The months weekly totals added up to \$148.53(!!!!) and with Outreach matching those funds the All Faiths Pantry will receive our donation in the amount of \$300.00!!! All Saints has been asked by Lynn Stutzman and the PAFC (Parma Area Family Collaborative) to help for the 2nd year to be a host and distributor of their Helping Hands Project. As we team together (alongside other congregations in our community) with PAFC we will be paired with a Parma City School (State Road Elem) and a number of it's families to contact, itemize, purchase (with funds from a county grant through PAFC), organize and distribute to them their children's school supplies for the upcoming school year. 2010 Relay For Life of Parma, Ohio

The American Cancer Society Relay For Life is a life-changing event that gives everyone in communities across the globe a chance to celebrate the lives of people who have battled cancer, remember loved ones lost, and fight back against the disease. At Relay, teams of people camp out at a local high school, park, or fairground and take turns walking or running around a track or path. Each team is asked to have a representative on the track at all times during the event. Because cancer never sleeps, Relays are overnight events up to 24 hours in length.

Celebrate - The Survivors Lap

Relay starts with a Survivors Lap an inspirational time when survivors are invited to circle the track together and help everyone celebrate the victories we've achieved over cancer. The Survivors Lap is an emotional example of how Relay participants are creating a world with more birthdays like those of each individual on the track.

Remember - The Luminaria Ceremony

After dark, we honor people who have been touched by cancer and remember loved ones lost to the disease during the Luminaria Ceremony. Candles are lit inside bags filled with sand, each one bearing the name of a person touched by cancer, and participants often walk a lap in silence.

Fight Back - The Fight Back Ceremony

Last, there is a Fight Back Ceremony, where we make a personal commitment to save lives by taking up the fight against cancer.
