## July & August Treasurer's Report

Both July and Augusts pledge offerings were less than budget. However, because disbursements were also less in both months, the net results were positive each month resulting in net cash flow of \$950 in total for the two months.

Year-to-Date through August 31<sup>st</sup>, there is a positive cash flow of \$13,200 because total costs for supply clergy have been only \$4,500 for the eight months.

## Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

We had a wonderful start to our Good Shepherd Sunday school. First we would like to thank Sally and her crew for the delicious pancake breakfast that was enjoyed by all and especially the children.

Most importantly we had a wonderful celebration on that first Sunday with the Baptism of Elexiah Marie Hnatiak. We prepared the children by reviewing with them the Sacrament of Baptism and all of the signs and gestures used during Baptism: The Waters of the Holy Spirit poured on our heads in the name of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, and the Oil of Chrism placed on our forehead as we were claimed as Christ's own with the sign of the Cross.. We spoke about the Paschal Candle and that it is lit at Baptism as a symbol of the Risen Christ. Each child was given their own candle to light from the Paschal candle and as we sat quiet and still we were reminded that the light shining from the candle in our hands is the same as the light of the Paschal Candle. This seeing helps the children to discover that the very life of the Risen Christ is in each one of us. That light which lives in us and is a gift given to each one of us by God is to be shared with others throughout our entire lives. It was then wonderful to watch the children as they observed up close and participated by personally helping Father Christopher during this Blessed Sacrament of Baptism. Thank you again Father Snook you have truly been a blessing to our children.
